

Abraham Chapter 10:

1. And now, I Abraham did see all those things on the day before we entered into Egypt, being filled with the visions of heaven that night, for I feared greatly before the Lord concerning Sarai my wife, and had supplicated Him with many tears fearing that which may befall us.
2. Therefore Hayah my God had opened heaven to show me the gardens of the heavens, and all the glories awaiting us, even if we were compelled to sacrifice all things by the workings of His hands.
3. And now as I hath written, I did say unto Sarai, "Behold now, I know that thou art a fair woman to look upon: Therefore it shall come to pass, when the Egyptians shall see thee, that they shall say, This is his wife; and they will kill me, but they will save thee alive.
4. Say, I pray thee, thou art my sister, that it may be well with me for thy sake; and my soul shall live because of thee."
5. Now she did agree, and when we had entered into Egypt, just as I feared, messengers went and brought the queen, which was the princess of pharaoh, and questioned her. Sarai did say as she was instructed, and the princess did give me flocks and herds, and took Sarai.
6. I Abraham did fall unto the earth and did pray unto the Lord, with tears saying; "Oh Hayah! I received Sarai pure before thee, in our own house, even though I was first her master, still, if she should experience another, would I not have Eternal shame and misery, being filthy still, notwithstanding the glories thou dost show me? Forgive me! But help thou me!"

Now it came to pass that one of the princess' servants saw my distress and, not knowing the cause did say, "Come, she shall be treated well and honored, for thy mourning we shall intreat thee well, and we will give thee servants also for thy trouble, for know thee not that she shall be high and lifted up?" And now the servant had prophesied but knew it not.
8. Now it came to pass that there was a great mourning in the Land the next day, for the potency of all the men had fled away, and I Abraham knew it not because I was mourning and saying, "Oh Hayah I would that ye would take me home, please take my spirit, for ye can comfort me; then ye will gather Sarai by and by, but until then I die."
9. Now all the first day they were sacrificing and supplicating god, and on the second day all the people were sick and sore stricken, and they did drink holy milk and all manner of remedies, and the priests did go door to door with their potion, but I took not their drought saying, "I am not of thy people." And now it had not yet entered into my mind what great things Hayah was doing.

On the third day, terrible sores did come upon their bodies, and upon the fourth day the servant of the princess did come unto me, whose name was Shulem, and did say unto me: "Peradventure, were ye mourning for thy sister for some other reason, than that which ye both told us? Tell me truthfully, I will keep thee safe, but we must be delivered from whatever evil we have done."
11. I did say, "She is my wife." Wherefore Shulem did depart, and being afraid of his return, did disguise myself and went into the city all that night. But behold, a decree was published among all the people, saying; "Unto Abram, come hither; all the people shall witness thy fair treatment at the Temple's porch, or else let all Egypt be ~~another~~ unto the gods forever!"

Now it came to pass that all the people had gathered, and I Abraham did undo my covering and came forward: Lo, Sarai was dressed in fine white linen, and came running to me, and she did embrace me, and kissed me before all the people. And the people did all cheer, and I was astonished with tears.
13. Now Pharaoh did decree that I should be given ten fold of flocks, herds, servants, concubines, and treasure, and he did also mandate in the name of the Almighty God, that all men should regard me, and that none should ever harm me. Wherefore I Abraham did weep, and blessed Hayah.

And now, Pharaoh did have me come up and sit upon his throne, wearing his crown; he wearing the queen's crown, and the princess placing a feather in her hair, which is a sign of justice unto them, and taking their servants before me, entreated me concerning the mysteries of the universe. Wherefore I Abraham did teach them concerning those things which I saw in the Urim and Thummim.
